Our children's Sunday School continued uninterrupted throughout the summer, and I was really happy with the number of children attending each week. I can't wait to see how many more happy and eager children will join us this year! We've got a couple of new teachers along with our returning favorites, a new curriculum, new floors, and LOTS of enthusiasm for this new year. For our returning students — welcome back! We can't wait to hear about your summer adventures. For those who don't usually venture upstairs during the Sunday



School hour.....I challenge you to come and give us a try. I promise that you'll have a great time!

As pleased as I am with our growing numbers, I can't help but notice so many children in the worship service each week that I haven't gotten the opportunity to know well yet. For all parents of children ages 3 years through High School, we'd love to become a part of your child's life and spiritual development. Just by bringing your family to church each week shows that you value your relationship with God and are fostering those same beliefs and values in your children. Did you know that by simply sending your child to Sunday School each week, you will add over 800 additional hours of Christian teaching before your child graduates from High School? Pretty incredible, huh? If that's not reason enough to convince you, let me give you a few more!

Top 5 Reasons To Bring Your Child to Sunday School:

- <u>Age Appropriate Teaching</u>. Bible lessons are aimed toward children's developmental level (and.....our teachers make learning fun!).
- <u>Friends!</u> While in class, your child will build positive friendships with their peers while exploring God's Word together. Sunday School provides a place to belong where you are known and valued. It is a place for children to experience Christian fellowship.
- **Spiritual Mentors** In addition to teaching stories from the Bible, your child's teacher also serves as a Christian role model who helps inspire the faith of your child.
- Children Learn to Respect, Appreciate and Utilize the Bible. Understanding God's Word doesn't come naturally. Sunday School allows children to explore the Bible using stories, games and fun activities. Learning biblical truths will help elevate the importance of the Bible in a child's life.


Attention: Men of Ascension

SEAFARER'S MINISTRY

<u>Seafarers' Ministry Christmas Gift Box Program Starts</u> Sunday September 21st thru Saturday October 18th

Ascension Episcopal Church and Ascension Episcopal School are sponsoring the Seafarers' Ministry Christmas Box Program starting October $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ and running the full month. The church participated in this program last year and with the help of our school we will continue to build this wonderful outreach effort. There will be a collection area in the Narthex of the Sanctuary for the church or items may be taken to the school office.

Crew sizes vary between 8 and 30, with an average number of 22 seafarers to gift per ship. In 2013, we placed 10,378 gifts on board 432 ships which had seafarers from 69 different countries! These gifts had been donated to the seafarers by 228 churches and organizations! The Christmas boxes are personally carried to each ship by your staff of Port Chaplains. We begin shortly after Thanksgiving and continue gifting seafarers until all the gifts have been distributed!


