Summer at Ascension

May

Fertile Ground Workshop May 17th - 9am - 4pm to discern our future

Ascension is in a very good place. We are stable and secure, but we have the potential to make an even greater impact for the Kingdom. What is that impact? I believe the Holy Spirit wants to give us a new vision for our potential at Ascension about how we can welcome new and different people into our midst. This *fertile ground workshop* is one small step for listening to the Spirit's movement at Ascension.

Denise Trevino of the Diocese of Texas will be coming on May 17th to facilitate. This is <u>not</u> outreach and mission work. This is expanding the Ascension family. We are working to create a space where multicultural people are welcome in worship. Denise is the head of the intercultural ministry at the Diocese. If we are going embrace our Gospel identity, we, as a whole community, will need to do some deep thinking - about our mission field and how to authentically make room for fellow disciples at Ascension. Please RSVP starting May 2nd on the church website with who in your family is coming, especially number and ages of your kids. We will have activities for them throughout the day.

If you think this is a great initiative or terrible, we want you to help us discern the future of Ascension's identity.

Mother's Day and Children's Choir

Ascension Day and School

Come out Thursday May 15th for the school/church celebration of Ascension Day at 7pm. The AES kids will be singing and we will have Ascension Day scriptures, sermon, and prayers. May 14th is the school's volunteer appreciation day, and May 18th is the AES Graduation ceremony. Also come out Sunday May 4th for the school book fair.

Adult Education - Rector's Class

We will wrap up the Revelation class at 9:30am on May 18th. June

It can include high school, college, welding school, nursing school, or whatever formal course of study the graduate has completed. June 1st is also Whitsunday. It is a day where we invite Ascension to support the Episcopal Endowment Fund. Should you choose to give, there will be white envelopes available that day. The "Episcopal Endowment Fund" (Canon 16) is administered by the Church Corporation Trustees with net earned income to apply to payment of the salary of the Bishop of the Diocese. It applies as revenue support toward the Diocesan (Assessment) Budget.

NEWCOMER CORNER

As we enter the summer time heat, trying to remember what temperatures below 90 degrees were like, I am excited for the energy we've had this spring. Ascension has welcomed a number of great newcomers into our growing church community. Each person is adding her or his specific gifts and presence that we so vitally need to minister in our neighborhood. Let's keep up our inviting and warm welcoming spirit as the temperatures start to skyrocket!

Beginning May 10th on each second Sunday, we will be holding a drop-in class during the 9:30am Sunday School hour for any visitor (or longtime member) who would like to know more about Ascension. This time will be hosted by our Newcomer Minister, Paul Belk. Think of this time as a snapshot of the larger Get-to-Know-Ascension Weekends.



Our next Get-to-Know-Ascension Weekend will be held in the fall. This Friday evening and Saturday morning retreat serves as our membership class. At the end of it, you are fuller a member of the Ascension family and will have the option to be confirmed into the Episcopal Church before one of the Bishops during his or her next visit. Start looking for a save the date announcement sometime later this summer.

Fertile Ground in a nutshell

We will explore Cultural Competent Leadership Skills. This is taking a look at things that we think people need in today's fast changing world to be more effective and inclusive leaders. Then we will follow with learning RESPECT Guidelines which is foundation of how we will be in community together for the day. We'll move into learning and practicing a tool called Mutual Invitation and get a chance to practice it thru Bible study and at other times in the day. This is a tool that helps up to learn new ways to make sure everyone has been invited to speak without interruption. It's a subtle tool that helps us to neutralize environments when one or two people usually do all the talking and others remain silent.

Then we will study culture both from an internal and external perspective and explore what it means when churches have their own internal and external culture and what that is like for newcomers coming in. We'll then explore different communication styles and get a chance to learn more about our own style and those around us.

Respectful Communications Guidelines

- R = take Responsibility for what you say and feel without blaming others
- **E** = use Empathetic listening
- **S** = be Sensitive to differences in communication styles
- P = Ponder what you hear and feel before you speak
- **E** = Examine your own assumptions and perceptions
- C = keep Confidentiality
- TRUST ambiguity because we are **not** here to debate who is right or wrong

Also, we will begin exploring power in our own lives and from a church context. There will be some small group work with "Photo Language" and others that will help us explore our own internal culture and those of other cultures.

Because all of the whole blood gets divided into the 3 therapeutic components of platelets, red blood cells, and plasma Ascension may be responsible for touching the lives of 60 cancer patients, allowing them to continue with therapies, treatments and surgeries, bringing them ever closer to the goal of eliminating the disease from their lives.

Especially over the Easter weekend, it is appropriate to recognize the importance of giving blood and saving lives. As Christians, the celebration of Christ's ultimate sacrifice for all of mankind is poignantly demonstrated in the small act of one human being giving blood to save another's life. As it says in the Bible: "Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." "Hebrews 13:16

I would like to invite you to set up another blood drive with MD ANDERSON this year, perhaps even this summer in July or August when the blood supply dips dangerously low.

Many people are unaware of the significant amount of blood products it takes to provide cancer patients with the cutting edge treatment and therapy they deserve. 
