The Lenten Wednesday Program

Beginning March 12th and Continuing through April 9th, you and your children are invited to join us at 6:00pm for stations of the cross that lasts just over 20mins. The stations were made by AES students. We will go to the parish hall for a light soup supper after stations. If you prefer, you may bring different food for your family and eat with us in the Parish Hall. **The nursery will be available from 6:00pm-7:15pm for children up to 4 years old.** Toward the end of the meal, Fr. Todd will lead a brief (20minute) teaching and meditation about 3 of the stations each week, based on writer contributions.



THIS IS WHERE WE NEED YOU:

Calling all writers. In Lent, we will have a five week series with teaching and drama. Will you write a 5-10 min play telling the story of Stations of the Cross per week as seen below? We would like to cover three stations a week. It can be written for one actor or dozens. They will of course have to be approved by Fr. Todd and he is happy to help you with any questions. They will be based on the Scriptural Way of the Cross:

- Week One: Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, betrayed by Judas and arrested and is condemned by the Sanhedrin.
- Week Two: Jesus is denied by Peter, judged by Pilate, scourged and crowned with thorns.
- Week Three: Jesus takes up his cross, is helped by Simon to carry his cross, and meets the women of Jerusalem
- Week Four: Jesus is crucified, promises his kingdom to the repentant thief, and entrusts Mary and John to each other.
- Week Five: Jesus dies on the cross and is laid in the tomb.

A New Lenten Practice

Not everyone may know that every Tuesday and Thursday, people who have no direct association with Ascension come into our sanctuary balcony for an hour. During that time, they connect with their bodies and spirits in view of our amazing stained glass windows. In addition, many of the Ascension staff members join them.



I'm talking about yoga. Some may initially balk at the idea of incorporating an originally eastern practice into a church, but as with so much we do in life, it is about intent. Practicing yoga can be a form of prayer to God with your body and your breath when you make it so, especially when you are in a church sanctuary!

As we enter into this season of Lent, we are brought to a place of reflection and pilgrimage toward the cross with Jesus. Years ago, in addition to fasting from something during Lent, I also took on the idea of adding something, of submitting myself to a practice. 


Dear Parishioners,



Amazing Talent of the Ascension School Students

The Ascension students, from 1st-5th grade, under the guidance of Janis Edel, have constructed astounding representations of the stations of the cross. Each of the 57 enrolled students has contributed to the fourteen stations. They will be hung around the sanctuary with plates identifying each station on Ash Wednesday. As a teaser, here you will find the first five stations. They are crafted out of simple clay and attached to a wooden board measuring about 14 inches square. God's Word Read Aloud in God's House by God's People

We are continuing our tradition at Ascension of reading the Bible from Genesis through Revelation during Lent. Readings are approximately a half hour and are scheduled on weekday mornings and evenings and on Saturday morning. You may use the Bible on the lectern or your own. You may read in the language of your choice. You may stand or sit and if access is difficult you may sit in the first row.

Sign up for a reading and include your telephone number. You'll be called the night before as a reminder. You may sign up online starting Monday on the church website, by clicking on the front page link. There is also a sign up sheet near the name tag table in the narthex on Sunday morning. You show up at church at the scheduled time and read aloud the verses assigned. The church will be open and the lights in the altar area turned on. If for some reason you find the church locked, the office has the key. If you wish to have an audience, you must bring your own. You may share this experience with a friend or church member or read on your own. It is suggested that you preview your reading the night before. If you would prefer to read at noon, choose the last reading in the morning or the first reading in the evening on that day and slide it to noon.

Please note that the Sunday sign-up and the online sign-up will be combined on Monday, and the newest version printed out the Friday before Sunday. So what this means, is if you sign-up on Saturday, you will not see your name reflected on the sign-up sheet, but you are signed up. Last year we did not have any conflicting shifts, but if for some reason there is this year, Pam Schwabrow will simply contact the two parties that have signed up. One may choose to take a different time slot, or share the time. It will be up to you.

Easter Eggs for Outreach!!!

In addition to the traditional egg hunt after the 10:30 service on Easter Sunday, Ascension will be hosting two additional hunts. As part of a Community outreach event, which will be held on Saturday April 19th, we will be welcoming community service professionals and there families to have lunch on us, and an egg hunt for their children. 
