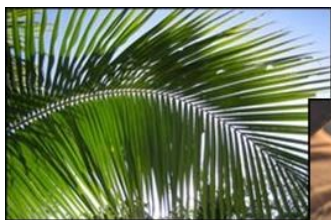


ASCENSION TIDINGS

LENT THROUGH EASTER



Greetings in the name of Jesus,

Sunday School

Read more from Robi inside because we continue to work on a vision and new plan for Sunday School, it's effectiveness, and timing. We are going to try a test run before I go on sabbatical. Starting May 1st, we are integrating Sunday School into 10:30am worship.

Sabbatical

Many of you are interested to know about Sabbatical planning. Here are some basics for the sabbatical which starts on May 16th.

General objective

Sabbatical is a time of renewal for the clergy AND the congregation. The congregational leadership finds new ways to minister, the priest "resets" and dreams about the future of ministry at Ascension.

The Bishop expects clergy to take sabbaticals. After talking with Bishop Fisher, I realized that my dream of traveling the world interviewing preachers was way too big for my stomach, even if I had received funding. During my sabbatical my family and I will:

Go to Atlanta for the “festival of homiletics” (preaching conference) and back at the end of the week to start our road trip. <https://www.festivalofhomiletics.com/> (sans family but everything else will be with the family)

Road trip through the south.

Visit Sewanee, Virginia and Austin seminaries to chat with current professors about their view of the church of the future. Write a lot, specifically biographies/studies of great preachers. I am hoping to share excerpts of my writing process with the congregation.

When I come back I will be ready to rock and roll with you especially in the realm of community building and outreach. One big project that I am dreaming about is a community garden. The primary aim is not to grow zucchinis for their own sake, but to foster a community of servants for the needy. Take a look at the “after sabbatical” section for the dreams that will be percolating.

What I am not going to do

I have no desire to leave you all when I get back from sabbatical. I know the last sabbatical was not handled optimally and left the congregation drifting for too long. Your diocesan staff has put in guidelines and safeguards for making sabbatical great for clergy and congregations. I am not going on sabbatical then leaving you all holding the bag in the Fall! We have too much good stuff to work on together.

After sabbatical

Community Garden 2016 -2017

Vision

- The Garden will be the means to build a community of servants who feed the needy.

Primary Goals

- Build community among Westchase businesses, community groups, faith groups, and public servants.
- Grow fresh produce for underserved families and individuals.
- Cultivate and harvest produce on a schedule using church members and community groups who will work the garden.
- Donate produce to Mission of Yahweh and West Houston Assistance Ministries or other ministries we target.

Location

There are a couple of location options:

- Option 1 - At a place central to the Westchase business district.
- Option 2 - Onsite at Ascension.

There are lots of details to figure out. If onsite, these fenced in, raised beds will be located in between the northern face of parish hall and the southeastern fence line of the big field. The enclosure will be on the western side of the grassy area. (the eastern side has a ditch that floods periodically).

Non-negotiables

- It has to be attractive, well kept, and increase the “welcoming face” of Ascension wherever it is located.

Logistics

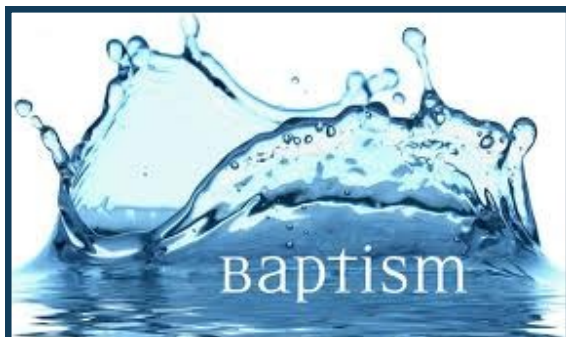
- Irrigation
- Fencing – the type of foods we grow will dictate the type of enclosure. Produce like tomatoes would need to be fully enclosed with squirrel and bird proof fencing and high profile sign advertising that the garden is a ministry of Ascension and a clear explanation on how to get involved.
- Raised beds, soil, and seeds. Girls scouts silver award projects and / or boy scouts install raised beds.
- Tom Sutton be our resident “expert” on the horticultural stuff and help raise up other experts.

REACH OUT

There is some very real excitement bubbling up in Outreach as our first Outreach Committee has been meeting. It is a great group, ready to lead Ascension out into our community. We have been developing a mission statement and setting goals....and along the way developing our first larger project.

A-Dios (Spanish for “to God”) as well as “goodbye” meaning leaving the campus. We will celebrate our First A-Dios on Saturday April 9th and Sunday April 10th. On Saturday a group of us will travel to WHAM (West Houston Assistance Ministries) to help staff the Pantry and Second Blessings (the resale shop). As many of you know, both of these areas have recently been renovated and enlarged. While this is wonderful, it has increased customer traffic but volunteers to assist in staffing has not increased. This has led to a critical stage in the Pantry.

The new Pantry is the state of the art for pantries-it is arranged like a grocery store and clients are given a grocery cart and a chart so they can select their own groceries within guidelines. But...each client must be accompanied by a volunteer to oversee and assist them. When they do not have enough volunteers to staff, they have to turn clients away.

Second Blessings has a new manager who is doing a wonderful job of creating a very positive sales space, but they are also in need of people to help. As this area does a better job, more funds are brought in the help with WHAM’s many ministries. WHAM has many areas they serve in our community, one area of interest is low income seniors. I hope we can help them enlarge this ministry to this very vulnerable population in our midst.

On Sunday April 10th, we will be working for the community on campus. We will host a large truck which will be placed in the parking lot to collect items for Second Blessings. As you come to church, you can pull up to the truck and we will have people who will help you unload your items. I understand housewares are one of their best selling items and they have a new children’s area that needs children clothes. Please consider spring cleaning and helping us fill the truck. We will have donation slips available.

We will also be assembling hundreds of “goody” bags for the students and faculty of Walnut Bend to support them as they start STAAR testing. This is such a wonderful partnership. During March, we have a group who will be reading to all of the first grade classes every week for Read Aloud Month. Ascension is also a sponsor of this event which will place books in children hands. Every week we have people who work in the Lunch Bunch and tutoring programs.

On A-Dios we will also have a group who will cook some small meals that will be frozen and available to take to parishioners when they are ill or need assistance. We are still working on a couple of other projects...so expect to see more. Many hands make light work as well as friends, we hope you will join us in this event.

You may have noted a new effort...Fill the Box Sunday. This will be an ongoing event, on the first Sunday of every month we will collect food for WHAM in the box in the narthex. Any items that are in critically short

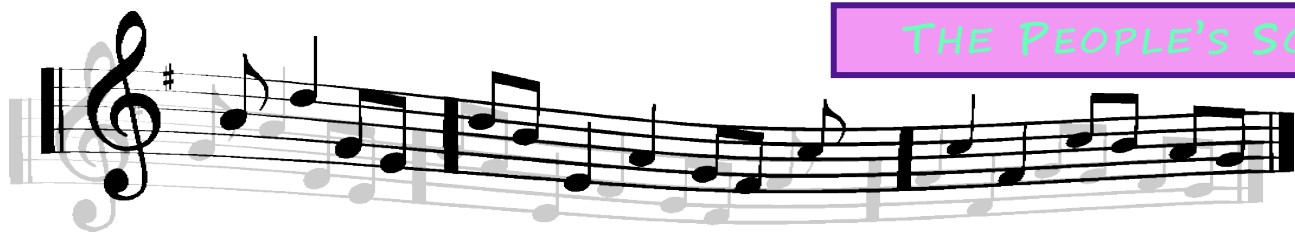


supply will be noted on the sign and in the weekly email. Please help us with this ongoing effort to support those who are losing their jobs in this current economy.

I have also been leaving the building a lot this last couple of weeks. I consider that we at Ascension are building relationships in the community, so I go out and meet the people in charge before we consider going in to volunteer. There are many wonderful places that need our joyful spirit and hands. Like Dr. Seuss said...."oh! the places we will go!" Look for news here in the upcoming Tidings, on the church website as we develop the Outreach button, in church bulletins and weekly emails, as well as announcements from the altar.

Lent is here, and Easter is coming!

Although there's plenty of new Lent and Easter music, we have a wealth of seasonal music that has stood the test of time. Many would never have been 'top 40 hits,' which probably helped them endure. They contain truths for all time no matter the original language. Well crafted words and music make it easier to remember the lesson that the hymn conveys. Don't underestimate the power of these songs. Not all of us can walk out of worship recalling every spoken word, but many of us can recall the music we sang. This makes the message portable. Notice how familiar hymns bubble to the surface when there are crises: *God bless America* and *Amazing grace* were sung widely as our collective comfort songs after 9/11. Families who have strayed from regular church attendance often sing from memory when they attend funeral services at their childhood church home. The hymns still sing their message. They are waiting for you.

During Lent, we recall our previous Lents as we sing the wonderful Isaac Watts hymn (#474) *When I survey the wondrous cross*, the 16th C. (#168) *O sacred head now wounded*, and the spiritual, (#172) *Were you there?* Personally, I remember childhood Palm Sunday processions. Who could think of celebrating Easter without (#207) *Jesus Christ is risen today*?

If you want to express your faith to a child, cuddle up your favorite little one with a favorite hymnbook. Sing your favorites. Be sure to say why they mean so much to you. What a wonderful gift to give, the story of Christianity in song.

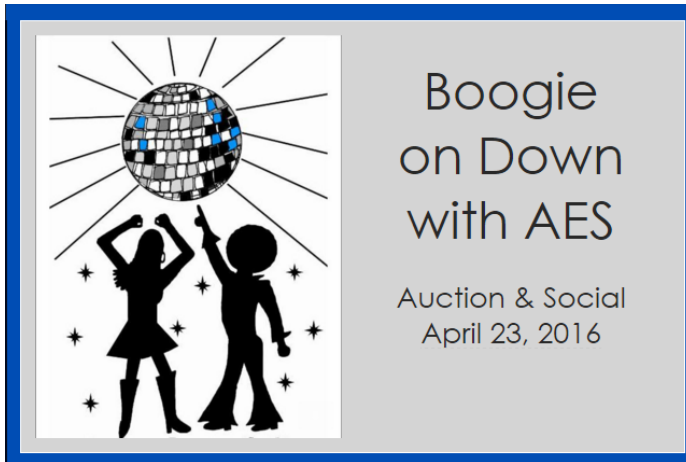

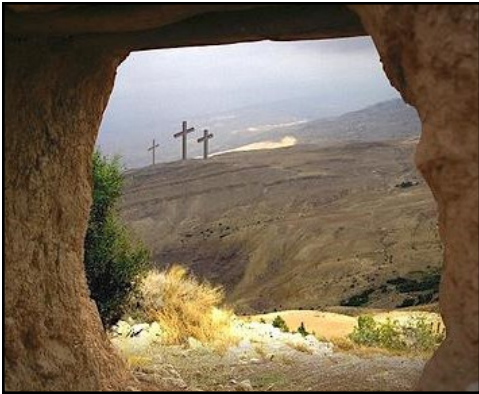

God's Word Read Aloud in God's House by God's People

We are nearing the end of tradition at Ascension of reading the Bible from Genesis through Revelation during Lent. There are a few spots still open. Readings are approximately 30 minutes and are scheduled on weekday mornings, evenings (except Wednesdays) and Saturday mornings. You may use the Bible on the lectern or your own. You may read in the language of your choice. You may stand or sit and if access is difficult you may sit in the pews.

Sign up for a reading and include your email address. You will be sent an email reminder a couple of days before your reading. You may sign up online starting at the beginning of February on the church website, by clicking on the front page link. There will also a sign up sheet near the name tag table in the narthex on Sunday morning. Come to the church at the scheduled time and read aloud the verses assigned. The church will be open and the lights in the altar area turned on. If for some reason you find the church locked, the office has the key. If you wish to have an audience, you must bring your own. You may share this experience with a friend or church member or read on your own. It is suggested that you preview your reading the night before. If you would prefer to read at noon, choose the last reading in the morning or the first reading in the evening on that day and slide it to noon.

Please note that the Sunday paper sign-up and the online sign-up will be combined on Monday, and the newest version printed out the Friday before Sunday. So what this means, is if you sign-up late Friday or on Saturday, you will not see your name reflected on the sign-up sheet, but you are signed up. Last year we did not have any conflicting shifts, but if for some reason there is this year, Pam Schwabrow will simply contact the two parties that have signed up. One may choose to take a different time slot, or share the time. It will be up to you. Remember in the Bible it says "...make a joyful NOISE unto the Lord,..." so come as you are and read as you can.

WHAM Food Drive...

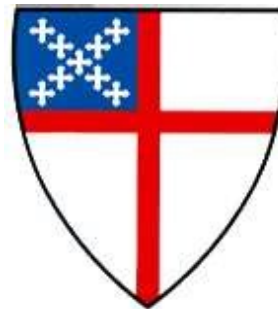
