Quality vs. Quantity

At a recent gathering of all Newcomer Ministers in the diocese, we talked about how we measure success. In order to remain in good standing with the grant foundation that funds the Newcomer Ministry initiative, each church must submit paperwork twice a year to the foundation committee talking about what is working and what is not. But what defines success? How are we to measure? More people giving money? A larger average Sunday attendance report?

The grant committee at our gathering said that while reporting average Sunday attendance and ministry spending will always be part of the paperwork, more important may be the individual success stories we get to be a part of. Quality over quantity, doing far and deep over spreading thin and wide.

Going into my report this time around is the story of two of my newcomer families. Over the past few years, the average membership of Ascension has started getting younger and bringing in more families with younger children. This has been an intentional move to provide ministries that are needed by younger people. Sarah and James Berrie and Liz and Chad Goodman, both parents of preschool and elementary age kids and both church members after the Newcomer Ministry began, saw the need for a group dedicated to parents to share their trials and triumphs and to grow in faith alongside others in the journey of parenthood. This fall we kicked off a new Sunday School class dedicated specifically to that idea lead by the Berries and Goodmans.

From curious newcomers to Sunday School teachers within about year. I count that as a resounding success! With our latest group of newcomers joining the church in at the end of September, I'm excited to see how deep their success stories go!



SEAFARER'S MINISTRY

<u>Seafarers' Ministry Christmas Gift Box Program Starts</u> Sunday September 21st thru Saturday October 18th

Ascension Episcopal Church and Ascension Episcopal School are sponsoring the Seafarers' Ministry Christmas Box Program starting October 1st and running the full month. The church participated in this program last year and with the help of our school we will continue to build this wonderful outreach effort. There will be a collection area in the Narthex of the Sanctuary for the church or items may be taken to the school office.

Crew sizes vary between 8 and 30, with an average number of 22 seafarers to gift per ship. In 2013, we placed 10,378 gifts on board 432 ships which had seafarers from 69 different countries! These gifts had been donated to the seafarers by 228 churches and organizations! The Christmas boxes are personally carried to each ship by your staff of Port Chaplains. We begin shortly after Thanksgiving and continue gifting seafarers until all the gifts have been distributed!


